Action: Information and Discussion

Peterson noted that a concern around the BAT had a concern brought to their attention regarding one of the public meeting laws and bringing information to City Councilors or County Commissioners.

Peterson noted that the BAT is an informal group, and information from the informal can be brought up to the County Commissioners or in the City Councils' sessions. But will still have to go through the public process at those times.

Paul Schuytema noted that most of the concerns were from Lincoln County (Tim Johnson) as the administrator was not in the loop regarding broadband from the past two years. Schuytema added that the BAT had put together guidelines stating they are not a governing body making decisions, however they are more of an informational sharing group. Schuytema shared the BAT covers the four counties of the EDA group.

There are 2 projects currently happening with the BAT: one involving Linn/Benton/Lincoln counties as well as the other project focusing on Lane County. Schuytema noted that both projects are on hold until the new guidelines are out.

Schuytema added that funding from the biggest supplier, the Broadband Technical Assistance Program (BTAP) won't have their money available until at least 2024. Schuytema shared that EDLAC will most likely be stepping up to take a larger leadership role here in the near future.

Schuytema shared that there was also a decent amount of tension along with the BAT itself, between the larger and smaller providers. Schuytema noted that everyone is working for the same thing, with better, more equitable, more affordable, and more reliable and accessible access across the entire economic development district.

Schuytema stated that it will be crucial to get everyone to ask to get their letter of support requests turned in early.

Commissioner Wyse asked about background on the BAT.

Schuytema noted that the BAT's were formed during the pandemic in June or July of 2020 as a general COVID response when rural regions convened these groups to align efforts. Schuytema shared that Oregon isn't doing the best job with setting up a statewide strategy to support Broadband. There are approximately 10 to 13 BATS around the state of Oregon with their own rules and ways to evaluate things.

Schuytema shared that the BATs are a way to share information and contain broadband service providers, IT techs, consultants, and planners. Schuytema noted that Joe Farnell from Blue Mountain Networks has been sharing information to the different BATs around the state.

Wyse asked about where the concern is coming from, and if the BAT has admin support from the COG or are the stakeholders taking care of everything themselves.

Schuytema answered that the stakeholders are taking care of themselves, and Sequoia Consulting has been rotating through the counties getting paid to help with support to the broadband action teams.

Wyse asked about attorney's associated with the groups that have cleared them from the concerns.

Schuytema answered that a few municipal Lincoln County attorneys gave the clear from any Public Meeting Law concerns.

Chair Buch noted that the Lane Council of Governments (LCOG) had

hired a consultant to move forward with their portion of the BAT. Randy Groves noted that there will be an update tonight from Lane Council of Governments regarding their BATs. Schuytema shared that he can share with the group the meeting invites to the BAT's monthly meetings for updates as their meetings are open to everyone. Schuytema shared that the LCOG took the lead on evaluating addresses and ended up putting in a bulk challenge for about 500-600 addresses that if validated by FCC, would be a little over \$4,000 in funding for each address that could come to the state of Oregon in ARPA BEAD funding. This is because the original addresses were not synced or completely accurate. 6. May 11th CWEDD Board Meeting Agenda (Attachment C) Schuytema shared that he will be planning to be in person and recommends that if the Vice-Chair (Schuytema) attends in person they should facilitate the CWEDD Board meeting. Schuytema shared that he will be planning to be in person and will try to be there to facilitate the meeting if need be. Peterson added that for the next meeting in August having a more detailed broadband update would be a great idea as Solarity's contract will go until October 2023. Peterson shared that having an update from Lane County's Contractor as well would be good as well to set the region set up for applying for funding. Peterson noted for this agenda the time will mostly be dedicated for an Oregon Employment Department Presentation. However, the focus of his presentation is on our region including Lane County. Peterson added that the structure of the BAT is similar to the others in the state. Peterson gave a summary of the different agenda topics that are
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	meeting will be a Hybrid meeting with an in-person location in Albany and a virtual option via Microsoft Teams. Peterson shared that there hasn't been a lot of feedback and response from the CWEDD project tracker, however the goal will be to talk about how those tools can be shared and utilized. Hart noted that the CEDS working groups could request participants in their individual meetings to fill out the CWEDD Project Tracker. Chair Buch added that there was a change in their Economic Development Manager. Jude Anderson is the new manager for Lane County. Peterson noted that Jude Anderson reached out about potentially applying for a new grant program and meeting with the EDA and CWEDD staff in May 2023 as well.
