SENIOR HEALTH INSURANCE BENEFITS ASSISTANCE

407 Corvallis residents received one-on-one counseling on their Medicare benefits through the Senior Health Insurance Benefits Assistance (SHIBA) program. 6 Medicare 101 seminars were held in Corvallis, and 13 residents volunteered as coaches for the program during 2023.

CARBON REDUCTION PROGRAM GRANTS

Totaling \$1.5 million

One grant will purchase an electric bike lane sweeper to be shared across the region. The second will complete primary engineering for the Corvallis to Albany shared use path, which will provide various ways to travel between the two cities.



PHILOMATH BLVD DESIGN EFFORTS

CAMPO is working with a consultant to develop functional designs to provide solutions to this area of Philomath Boulevard and is preparing to apply for grant funding for the project.



CORVALLIS OPEN STREETS EVENT

Car free streets

Staff assisted in the planning and data collection for Corvallis Open Streets, an event encouraging residents to enjoy car free streets for a day.



CASCADES WEST RIDE LINE

Provided 30,685 rides to residents

Cascades West Ride Line coordinates transportation services for eligible Oregon Health Plan (OHP) and Medicaid clients traveling to and from covered non-emergency medical services.
