RURAL COMMUNITY VISIT WITH CWEDD OCWCOG Community and Economic Development Planner Justin Peterson contracts planning services to the city one day per week. Justin is working with the city to update their Comprehensive Plan.

Staff helped write a grant for \$75,000 to build a restroom, new fence, resurface tennis courts, build an ADA path, and add lighting to Acadia Park. These grant funds significantly contributed to the \$141,000 project.

OCWCOG assisted with grant writing for speed radar signs through the Business Oregon and the Ford Family Foundation grant program. This Rural Capacity Funding allowed for grant writing to be available to various rural cities.

Cascades West Ride Line coordinates transportation services for eligible Oregon Health Plan (OHP) and Medicaid clients traveling to and from covered non-emergency medical services.

Cascades West Economic Development District (CWEDD) staff met with the city to hear about needs and prospect for grants.
